A validation workshop on strengthening capacity and catalyzing change for research and communication was held on April 4, 2023, at the Hilton Hotel. CORHA in collaboration with the Ministry of Health Ethiopia, MOWSA, UNFPA, and Spanish cooperation organized a High-Level technical dialogue on Harmful Traditional practices in Ethiopia.

As Dr Meseret Zelalem, MCAH LEO at the Ministry of Health Ethiopia, indicated in her keynote speech, Traditional Harmful practice has been an issue for Ethiopia for more than two decades. Though Ethiopia ratified the international laws regarding HTP, still there are several cases coming to the health centres caused by HTP, especially child marriage and teenage pregnancy. This shows that there is still a long way to go to combat child marriage and other HTPs.

The main aim of Today's Dialogue is to identify the bottlenecks for intervention, discuss different stakeholders' contributions to fight HTPs, develop priority actions to improve sexual and reproductive health and rights of women and girls as well as document the best practices and lessons. click here to read more.
